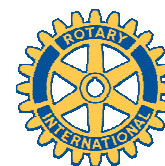

Shatenita Horton

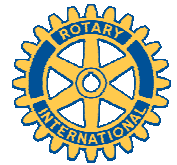

Jamie Cote



Jamie Cote shared his life with us via a Power Point presentation. He first knew about Rotary when he played on a Little League team that was sponsored by the local Rotary. He was born and raised in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire and was the 5th of 6 children. He grew up enjoying lots of water activities in the summer and then skiing on nearby mountains in the winter. He taught us that New Hampshire is home to the tallest mountain east of Colorado: Mount Washington which is over 6000 feet at its peak. NH has just 13 miles of shoreline on the Atlantic and has recorded wind velocity of 231 MPH.

Jamie was on the ski, golf and math teams in high school. He went to Brigham Young University in Utah and created a ski team with some funding from the school. He went to Russia on a mission trip in 1991 and was there in Leningrad when the coup took place. He married his first love, Deborah, in 1993, and together they were able to go back to Russia while he was river boat tour guide for three months. They were also able to travel to China with the same company and were there for 17 days. They moved to Columbia where **Jamie** helped to create Personalized Computers with his brother-in-law. He and Deborah have 5 children, Hannah, 14, amazing Martial Arts expert, Ian 10, a jock and very funny, Emily, 7, who charms her way into Daddy's heart, and just recently the twins, Carson and Jackson, who they call CarJack.
