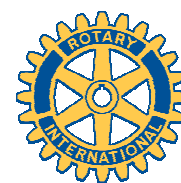

Program Summary

Columbia One Read:

Await Your Reply

Doyne McKenzie, Columbia Public Library

Doyne McKenzie from the Daniel Boone Regional Library told us about the *Columbia One Read Program*.

One Read, coordinated by the Daniel Boone Regional Library (DBRL) and now in its ninth year, is a community-wide reading program sponsored by a task force of local media and community agencies. This comprehensive program encourages adults of all ages to read one book and participate in thought-provoking discussion and activities.

One Read Goals

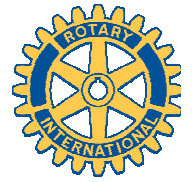
- To encourage leisure reading.
- To encourage community collaboration throughout the DBRL region
- To provide a variety of means of participation through book discussions and other programs.
- To provide resources for book discussion groups.

Choosing the Book

Each winter, the public submits suggestions for next year's book; usually anywhere from 50-150 suggestions are received. In January, a panel of community members reviews the suggestions, narrowing that list down to 10 titles, and then chooses two or three books to present for a public vote. It must be a book that is approachable, engaging and not too big. It must also be a book that provokes discussion.

The panel looks for books the community will enjoy reading and discussing, that have a broad-based appeal to readers of

different backgrounds and reading levels, and that address themes, issues and topics that will encourage and sustain spirited discussion.

This year the *Columbia One Read* book is [Await Your Reply](#) by Dan Chaon. Dan will be in Columbia on September 10th at Columbia College. This book is considered a “thriller” which involves 3 main characters: Miles Cheshire, Lucy Lattimore, and Ryan Schuyler.



The lives of these three strangers interconnect in unforeseen ways—and with unexpected consequences. Miles Cheshire longs to get on with his life, but he can't stop searching for his troubled twin brother, Hayden, missing for ten years. Lucy Lattimore who just graduated high school, sneaks away from the small town of Pompey, Ohio, with her former history teacher, arriving in Nebraska, in the middle of nowhere, to figure out the next move on their path to a new life. Ryan Schuyler, is being rushed to the hospital with a severed hand.

There are 4 weeks of programs surrounding the *Columbia One Read Program*. Some of the highlights include:

September 2nd there will be a discussion at Noon lead by Judge Frank Conley and at 7:00pm Julie Baka at the Columbia Library. September 7th, there will be a *Book Talk* Diane Lynch, President of Stephens College in Senior Hall at 7:00pm and on September 15th Mayor McDavid and his wife will lead a discussion at 7:30pm in the City/County Building.
