**Rob** shared his basic values and beliefs: Cooperation and consensus, sharing, community. People are basically good. Evil does exist, but it's rare and gets way too much press. He grew up Southern Baptist, now spiritual but no organized religion. He stated that he is decidedly left of what passes for the political center today.

**Rob** was born in Columbia and grew up south of town near what is now the airport on a "farm" where his family still lives. His childhood included hunting and fishing, tinkering and taking things apart, learning how to make fix or make things will little to work with. He attended school in Ashland until 7th grade, then West Junior and then Hickman. He graduated in the class of '71 and went on to attend UMC and graduated in 1978 in Electrical Engineering with a biomedical instrumentation emphasis. **Rob's** first job was Tektronix in Beaverton Oregon (Portland). He then joined another small startup in 1995 where he still works. After some company acquisitions he now works for the iGrafx division of Corel. His work has been writing software tools for designers. At Mentor it was for computer hardware designers, now for business process managers.

**Rob** was married in Oregon, divorced in 1996. He has two sons, Zack and Jake, who still live in Portland. Zack is getting married on the first of May!

**Rob** returned to Columbia in 2006 with his second wife and now works remotely over the internet for iGrafx. His parents and sister, Susan, live on the "farm" where he grew up, and he is there on most days. Susan is his best friend, bar none.

**Rob's** interests include:

- Like aphorisms, shared a few. Two current favorites are "It's a good thing we're not all just alike" (profoundly so), and "There's plusses and minuses to everything".
- Serial hobbyist. Interested in almost everything; he has had hobbies in rock collecting, photography, amateur radio, woodworking. Currently he's learning web site design/building.
- Thoroughly loved being a Dad, was cubmaster, soccer and especially baseball coach, active in kid's school.

In closing **Rob** noted his new film career. He ended by reenacting his breakout role in the short film "Sync" which was shot locally by aspiring, and talented, filmmakers. The role consisted of the word "Hey", the scene is about four seconds long. Admittedly he looks cute in hospital garb.
