

Lindsey and Sophie Cunningham Return to COMO

Sisters Lindsey and Sophie Cunningham spoke to members about their world travels during the past year. The sisters both graduated from Rock Bridge High School in Columbia and excelled for the University of Missouri women's basketball team. They last spoke to Metro Rotarians just before Sophie began her WNBA career with the Phoenix Mercury.

Sophie gave an overview of her first her as a professional basketball player. She appears in 32 WNBA games and started in 5 of those. She led all rookies in free-throw shooting percentage during the year making 30 of 34 attempts (88.2%). At the conclusion of the season, she had about ten days before the start of the Australian Women's National Basketball League (WNBL). In Australia, she played for the Melbourne Boomers and had a very good year. She averaged 11.6 points per game, 3.6 rebounds per game and 2.3 assists per game. She noted the biggest difference between the WNBA and international play was the fundamentals. Internationally, the players are not quite as athletic as WNBA players, and fundamentals are focused on more. Members were reminded that the WNBA players are not paid nearly the same as their counterparts in the NBA, and most players venture overseas to play as soon as the WNBA season concludes. It was pointed out that more money could be made playing overseas than here in the U.S.



One special highlight that Sophie wanted to share was the opportunity to meet the late Kobe Bryant. She spoke of how the NBA legend spoke to her team in Phoenix last year and shared words of wisdom. She stated his words meant a lot and she was very happy to visit one-on-one with him.

Looking ahead, Lindsey indicated that she plans to stay in the mid-Missouri area and is currently exploring employment opportunities in the medical sales field. Sophie is busy preparing for the start of her second WNBA season, and she is awaiting word on when it may begin. Once the WNBA season concludes, Sophie indicated she is considering offers to continue playing in Spain, Turkey or Russia.
