Central Missouri Junior Achievement

Morgan Dennehy (right) is the District Manager of Operations for Junior Achievement (JA) in Central Missouri. JA is a nonprofit organization founded in 1919 that is the world's largest organization dedicated to giving students from kindergarten through high school the knowledge and skills they need to own their economic success and open up a world of possibilities.

JA complements the hard work and dedication teachers put in to teaching their students. Their programs help young people make the connection between the classroom curriculum and life after graduation. They also help students see the possibilities around what they



can be, by giving them additional tools and the confidence to be successful.

JA has been in Central Missouri since 2008. Morgan stated that JA of Central Missouri serves 19 mid-Missouri counties and over 13,000 students were served last year. Over 100 volunteers helped to ensure these students received a quality education. Of individuals who have participated in JA programs, 97% have graduated high school or received a GED or higher. Also, 98% of the students indicated that they feel confident in their ability to manage money.

Morgan stated that JA offers programs for students pre-Kindergarten age through high school. The classes cover a wide range of areas for elementary students ranging from students learning about themselves, families, and communities, to lessons about cities, states, and our nation. In middle school, programs are more economics based, and a focus on career exploration begins. High schoolers participate in programs covering financial literacy, work and career readiness, and entrepreneurship.
